The purpose of the Japanese Society for Mother Tongue, Heritage Language, and Bilingual Education (MHB) is to explore language education methods, theories, and research methods related to how infants, children, students, and other learners in multilingual environments in Japan and abroad acquire multilingual skills.

The 2023 conference will be held under the theme "In Search of Equity in Language Education: Reconsidering Bilingual Deaf Education" and will be held online from August 3 to 6, 2023.

In MHB's research areas of language education, including teaching Japanese as a heritage language overseas, Deaf and hard-of-hearing children, CLD children in Japan, and minority languages, securing information accessibility, language rights, and the right to education for learners are not always guaranteed. This is because providing "Equality" of opportunity for all learners does not guarantee "Equity" of results. This year's MHB conference will focus on the theme of "Equity in Language Education". We hope you will join us in discussing bilingualism in Deaf Education.

Professor Professor Ruth Swanwick (University of Leeds), Dr. Daniel Fobi, and Mr. Richard Doku, all specialists in deaf education, will deliver the keynote address on the theme, "Bi-Multilingual early childhood deaf education: cross-context conversation."

In addition, Dr. Soya Mori (Institute of Developing Economics) will give a special lecture titled "A Deaf person's self-advocacy: Life strategies related to Sign Language." This special lecture will be open to those who have not registered to attend the conference.

[Application Guidelines for Research Presentations]

1. Details of the application

Research related to the research areas of the MHB Society that have not yet been published. It is not limited to this year's research topics.

For the objectives and subject areas of the MHB Society, please refer to the Society's Regulations at <u>https://mhb.jp/kaisoku</u>.

2. Language of presentation

Japanese, English, and Japanese Sign Language (however, words in other languages may be included for illustrative purposes).

3. Deadline

Deadline: May 31, 2023 (Wed.) 23:00 (Tokyo time: UTC+9) Applications are now closed.

Applications are open only to MHB members (general members and student members) (*Yearly membership fee for 2023 must have been paid). All co-presenters and the first presenter must be members of the society. Please refer to https://mhb.jp/admission for information on how to register as a member of the society and where to pay the annual membership fee.

All co-presenters as well as the first presenter must register for the conference.

One person cannot be the first presenter for more than one presentation.

The time slots for oral presentations cannot be selected.

4. Presentation categories

- (1) Oral presentation (research presentation/practical report)
- (2) Short presentation (research presentation, practice report, demonstration)

5. Presentation format and time

(1) Format

Oral presentation: The main focus is on providing information on a coherent body of research and practice reports. For the first 18 minutes, the presenter will give a one-way presentation to the participants using the ZOOM meeting, and this will be followed by 10 minutes of Q&A.

Short presentation: The purpose of short presentations is to deepen the discussion on emerging research, practice reports, teaching materials, etc. in an exchange of ideas. (Please refrain from presenting at the planning stage before data collection.) The first 8 minutes of the presentation will be given by the presenter using a ZOOM meeting in one direction to the participants, followed by a 20-minute exchange of opinions.

(2) Presentation time

Oral presentation: 18 minutes for presentation + 10 minutes for Q&A, total 28 minutes

Short presentation: 8 minutes for presentation + 20 minutes for Q&A, total 28 minutes

7. Acceptance/rejection criteria

Oral presentation:

(1) Whether the theme is appropriate for MHB

(2) Whether the research/practical theme contributes to the advancement of practice and research in mother tongue, heritage language, and bilingual education.

(3) If it is a research presentation, whether it clearly states the motivation for the research, a review of previous research, and the position of the research, and if it is a report of practice, whether it clearly states the significance of the practice, together with the research theme and methods, the results and discussion.

(4) Whether the presentation's content is recognized as unique, original, and significant compared with previous research.

Short presentation:

(1) Whether the theme is appropriate for MHB

(2) Whether the contents of the presentation are unique, original, and significant in comparison with previous studies, practices, and teaching materials
